### ENGINEERING STUDENTS BUILDING A CONCRETE TOBOGGAN WITH INSIGHTS FROM LAFARGE EXSHAW

When engineering students need to learn about cement and concrete to get an edge in a competition, where do they go? Lafarge Exshaw of course!

In late September, we welcomed more than 25 students from the UCalgary Engineering Department as they began their entry for the Great Northern Concrete Toboggan Race. The race is an annual event that brings together upwards of 20 post-secondaries from across the country to compete.

The students design and construct a toboggan with a metal frame and concrete running surface. The sled has to hold five people who race it down a snow-covered hill. In addition to the overall winner, teams also receive prizes for best steering and best safety.

Their sled will be shipped east in mid-December in advance of the competition in Newfoundland in February 2024.

## WATER PUMPING OVER THE BERM

The pond adjacent to Highway 1A falls within Lafarge's quarry lease. Each year, we transfer clean storm and groundwater from the limestone quarry to this nearby pond before winter. This proactive measure helps prevent potential flooding within the quarry and falls in our quarry permit regulations. ## LAFARGE CANADA AND ATCO ANNOUNCE 12.5 YEAR SOLAR VIRTUAL POWER PURCHASE AGREEMENT

Lafarge Canada and ATCO have inked a 12.5-year virtual power purchase agreement. Through this deal, the Lafarge Exshaw Cement Plant will secure all solar energy from the Empress Solar project, meeting 34% of its power needs until 2036.

"We're continually assessing ways we can reduce our environmental impact while actively pursuing sustainable solutions within our operations," said Brad Kohl, president and CEO of Lafarge Canada (West). "Our collaboration with ATCO underscores our commitment to adopting renewable energy at our plants and sites, which is key to reducing our reliance on fossil fuels."

#### WINDSCREEN UPDATE



### Lafarge remains committed to installing windscreens around the Exshaw plant; however, we are adjusting the timeline.

This project is of significant importance to the community and serves as a pivotal pilot initiative. The outcome of this pilot program will have a profound impact on future investment into the technology, so we want to ensure there are favourable conditions – windy and dry weather – to conduct detailed testing.

This project is ready to go. The engineering drawings are ready for tender, we have the necessary development permit from the Municipal District of Bighorn and we are ready to start construction.

Our revised plan is to initiate construction of the windscreens immediately following our regular Winter Shutdown. This will allow us to activate the pilot project under optimal circumstances and ensure the best possible results for the community.
